DU LEADS GREEK SYSTEM AT KU

Dear brothers,
Since the Chapter officer installation in November, the Chapter has presented the new leadership with challenges that required attention to current projects, in addition to sparking new endeavors, while maintaining the levels of performance expected of Delta Upsilon. Now with the spring semester under way, the Chapter continues its role of excellence, not only as a figure to be admired among other Delta Upsilon chapters, but as a fraternity that is known to excel in membership, academic performance, and athletics at KU.

Awards and Honors

Kansas DU's progress continues to fetch attention. After earning four of the seven Chapter Excellence Awards at the annual Greek Chapter Recognition Night last year and being only one of two fraternities awarded among many sororities, the Chapter looks forward to our return to glory by claiming at least six of the seven excellence awards, as we did two years ago. In philanthropy and University participation, the Chapter took second place in Homecoming with Kappa Alpha Theta. The Greg Wilkerson Memorial football tournament was successful again this year, with the Chapter and its participating competitors raising nearly \$4,000 for the Boys and Girls Club of Lawrence. Delta Upsilon 1 took the trophy home after beating Beta 1 as they maintain their winning streak, which was 6-0 at that point in the season.

Academics

The Chapter stands in the top 10 among 28 IFC and NPHC fraternities with a G.P.A. above the all-university and all-male averages. This semester the Chapter placed 10th with a cumulative G.P.A. of 2.94. The number of members who scored above a 3.0 shot up from 45 members last semester to 50 members. Our academic performance bears no limits; therefore, as a Chapter we will invariably strive toward academic success.

Intramurals

Delta Upsilon carries on with its competitive rampage in all major sports. Last season we were defending champions in floor hockey and swimming. This year the flag football team went 14-1 to take second on the Hill, while collecting the Kappa Kappa Gamma flag football tournament trophy on the way by beating Phi Delta Theta 1. With many accomplishments already behind us, we look forward to competing this spring as our basketball team remains undefeated for the season, and our swim and golf teams sustain their undefeated streaks that have stretched as far back as 2002.

Leadership Development

The Chapter unflinchingly provides the University with leaders. **Jeff Dunlap '05** is in his final stretch as student body vice president, and **Wes Osbourn '05** is senator for the School of Business. The Interfraternity Council's fraternity recruitment programs will be run by **Richard Young '07**, vice president for recruitment, along with me on the Judicial Board as a running candidate for chief justice. **Trent Nelson '08** and **Brendan Camey '08** have been appointed as chairmen for intramurals and the National Panhellenic Conference liaison to the Interfraternity Council, where they will begin to expand their leadership potential. **Tyler Emery '06** is president of the Interfraternity Council Greek marketing team for the upcoming term, and **Justin Roberts '05** is the chief editor of the *University Daily Kansan* newspaper.

As president, I look forward to continuing our tradition of excellence by encouraging greater motivation, participation, and pride in our brothers, and I believe that our combined efforts with the Alumni Corporation Board toward renovating the north basement and other areas of the house is the next step. We have much to look forward to.

Curt Seymour '81 Builds One of KC's Fastest Growing Companies

Curt Seymour's undergraduate brothers knew he was a scrappy competitor on the intramural court. However, they probably didn't realize that he would one day catch a hot trend and lead a scrapbooking company to dizzying heights. Curt is vice president of K&Company, a scrapbooking wholesaler and distributor with products in many "big box" retailers, including Michael's, Hobby Lobby, Target, Barnes & Noble, and Kohl's. K&Company designs and markets everything from albums to papers to stickers, and everything else a scrapbook enthusiast could want. The company was co-founded by Curt and Kay Stanley (president of the company) after they realized the sweeping trend of scrapbooking, while peddling collegiate merchandise at a trade show in the late 1990s.

Kay, a KU graduate with a background in art and design, concentrated on the creative side while Curt put his sales and marketing skills to work. The company now employs

DU Alumnus Launches Online Advertising Giant

What do Priceline.com, eHarmony.com, and Overstock.com have in common besides each being one of the fastest growing online success stories? The advertising engine behind their success is media guru **Mike Robertson '81**.



Mike's company, Ocean Media Inc., in Huntington Beach, California, launched each company's advertising campaign and continues to provide all their media planning, buying, and placement. With 35 employees and more than \$100 million in billings, Ocean Media's growth is parallel to those they work with.

After college, Mike worked for Citicorp in Portland, Oregon. Mike later moved to Huntington Beach and worked for a money management firm, Fabian Financial Services, and then later its sister company, Fabian Publishing. It was there Mike experienced his first real taste for marketing and was instrumental in introducing several products and services via television and radio. His knowledge of media and the value it brings to companies inspired Mike to start Ocean Media in 1996. He says, "Placement of efficient, cost-effective

media with measurable results is what my clients need and rely on." He adds, "We will never arbitrarily spend any client's media dollars. If we can do the job for less money, we will."

Initially from Kansas City, Mike now resides in Newport Beach, California. His professional interests are balanced by his wife, Kim, and their four children: Chelsea, Garrett, Wyatt, and Emma. Mike enjoys traveling with his family, spending time at their farm in southeast Kansas, playing golf, and going fishing.

Mike is also passionate about a new non-profit foundation, Share A Smile Inc., that he and his wife started. For years, they have privately funded braces and dental work for those who cannot afford to do so. Mike insists that his family has been blessed in so many ways and this is one way in which they can give back. Mike says, "These children with severely crooked teeth are a target of so much teasing and ridicule, it feels great to help them smile proudly."
