SLAWSON FAMILY CHALLENGE EXTENDED

UPDATE ON CHAPTER HOUSE RENOVATIONS

Early this spring, the sons of **Don Slawson '55**, including **Craig '80** and **Todd '84**, and his wife, Judy, committed an additional \$100,000 as a challenge to all Kansas Chapter alumni. This challenge was on top of Don's lead gift of \$100,000 to help kick off the campaign. The Slawson Family generously offered a dollar-for-dollar match of new pledges to the campaign through August 17. So far, we have garnered \$67,325 in additional cash and pledges toward this goal. Additionally, many brothers who had made earlier pledges accelerated their payments so we could meet the cash flow needs during the construction phase this summer.

Brothers, closing the gap between signed pledges already made and the remaining balance of \$33,000 is essential so that we can take advantage of the Slawsons' generosity; which is why, with the Slawsons' approval, the challenge has been extended until September 30. This is a raise it or lose it challenge—that's why we need your attention and action right now.

From a distance it is hard to imagine the intricate planning, hard work, and personal sacrifice your alumni leadership and a handful of brothers have made to pull this project off. Logistically and fiscally, this has been a huge undertaking. Surely you can honor those men and the hundreds who have already done their part with cash gifts, pledges, and gifts of stock to support this campaign and project. If you are among those men who have already given, *thank you* for your generous support. If you have not stepped up, *now* is the time. PROJECT UPDATE

Brothers **Kurt Rhoden '93** and **Craig Laderoute '92** started getting the house packed up and emptied of all furnishings before the undergraduates moved out this spring. Removal of the carpet, flooring, and other interior finishes and fixtures took place immediately after graduation. Since then, an army of contractors and subcontractors worked methodically at a quick pace to get the house back in tip-top shape before the brothers moved back in for the fall semester. It was down to the wire, but everything stayed on track and looks great!

EXTERIOR IMPROVEMENTS

There are new energy-efficient windows throughout the structure, plus repairs to the envelope of the house to resolve some water infiltration and drainage issues. Two new custom exterior doors replaced the front and back doors of the house, giving the entrances a new impressive look and added security. There is a new basketball court in the parking area, along with new exterior lighting for safety of members. An outdoor stone fireplace has been constructed next to the west courtyard and the parking areas have been resurfaced and freshly striped. New landscaping has given the grounds a fresh look and great curb appeal!

INTERIOR IMPROVEMENTS

Inside, the dining room serving area has been reconfigured, and the kitchen has had a major *(Continued on page 2)*

The north basement has new tile and carpet, a renovated restroom and laundry area, and all stairwells have been repainted.

The Kansas Chapter Will Greatly Miss O. Kepler "Kep" Johnson Jr. '52

The Kansas Chapter of Delta Upsilon is sad to report the passing of alumnus **O. Kepler "Kep" Johnson Jr. '52**. Kep passed away at the age of 80 on July 7 in San Antonio, Texas. He was born February 19, 1931, in Atchison, Kansas, and grew up in Topeka until high school graduation.

Kep graduated from the University of Kansas and immediately entered the U.S. Marine Corps. He served with distinction in the Korean and Vietnam conflicts, retiring with the rank of major. After retirement, he served as a legal administrator in Kansas City and Houston, Texas. While in Houston, he earned an MBA from the University of Houston. After a second retirement, he and his wife, Barbara, relocated to Fredericksburg, Pennsylvania, where he became involved in the community, primarily the Museum of the Pacific War.

Delta Upsilon was a positive influence on Kep during his undergraduate career and inspired him to give back to *The Campaign for Kansas Chapter*. The brothers of Kansas Chapter are grateful to have had Kep as a part of their brotherhood. We will not forget his loyalty to the chapter.

Kep is survived by his wife of 55 years; his children, Barbara Johnson, Melanie Butler, O. Kepler Johnson IV, and Tom Johnson; and his sister, Martha Fee of Hutchinson, Kansas.

Wonderful, Loyal Cook Passes Away

Mildred Turner, longtime cook at Delta Upsilon, recently passed away at age 96 in Lawrence. Known affectionately as Millie, she cooked under housemothers Juanita Brown and Shirley Vaughn for 18 years, serving up breakfast, lunch, and dinner to hundreds of Kansas undergraduates, parents, and guests of our Chapter. Millie was a spiritual woman with a great sense of humor and sometimes was the brunt of our brothers' practical jokes. But, according to her son, Millie loved her years at Delta Upsilon and prized the t-shirt "her boys" had specially made for her emblazoned with "Magnificent Millie." It was still hanging in her closet many years later at the time of her death. We will all miss you, Millie!
