Dear brothers,

Kansas DU Chapter has taken on the challenge set by the Chapter Executive Board and the Alumni Corporation Board. These goals pertain to the Chapter's overall academic performance, the development and continuous improvement of the new member and member education programs, and consistent communication with Delta Upsilon Headquarters in Indianapolis. Since the end of the spring semester, the undergraduate Chapter has made great strides toward fulfilling these goals.

Academics

The Chapter has improved its overall cumulative G.P.A. to a 3.01 from last semester's 2.95, making last semester's grades the seventh semester out of the last eight that the Chapter has placed above a 3.0. DU has also seen a rise in the number of members who are achieving academic success—many scoring well above 3.0. More than 60% of the undergraduate brothers are maintaining this echelon of academic success. This trend has established the Chapter's goal of returning to the top five. To honor our academic achievers and take the opportunity to introduce professors to Kansas DU, the Chapter held a scholarship banquet dinner at the Chapter House on October 5, 2005.

Leadership

I have had the privilege of witnessing growth in many of our brothers. The participation and leadership among the Chapter officers and members have elevated the mindset of Kansas DU to a very positive and optimistic level, setting a new standard of excellence. On campus, the Chapter remains in great standing with the University and campus advisors. Specifically, I would like to recognize **Brendan Camey '08**, who has been serving the Fraternity as an undergraduate advisory board member and was recently elected to serve as vice president of public relations for IFC.

Recruitment

Kansas DU is focused on recruitment. I thank **Rod Barleen '97** and Recruitment Chairmen **Chris Albrecht '08**, **Brian Huntington '08**, and **Trent Nelson '08** for their relentless recruiting efforts. Impressive expectations have been set in motion for the spring 2006 pledge class. While the Chapter witnessed a decrease in the

number of members living in the Chapter House this past year, the Executive Board has been instrumental in developing new ideas on how we can recruit more effectively. They have been assisting the recruitment chairmen with the goal of filling the Chapter House to capacity next semester.

Intramurals

The presence of Kansas DU on campus has been aided by the success of the Chapter's participation in intramurals. The DU intramural flag football team not only won the Greg Wilkerson tournament for the third consecutive year, but they recently brought the Hill Championship trophy back to 1025 Emery. Similar success was experienced by Kappa Psi in match play. Kansas DU also won the Homecoming competition with our partners, the women of Alpha Chi Omega.

Alongside the brothers of Kansas DU, I look forward to seeing the progress we make, which will further prove that Delta Upsilon is one of the strongest fraternities at the University of Kansas.

DU Alumnus Holds Prestigious Position

Senior Economist, Federal Reserve Bank

Kansas Chapter of Delta Upsilon has claimed many prominent and outstanding alumni through the years in many fields of endeavor. From medicine, law, education, business, to the arts—you name it we have a DU in everything. We even have one at “The Fed”—Federal Reserve Bank, that is.



Charles Himmelberg '86 is senior economist, capital markets function, for the Federal Reserve Bank of New York. Charlie is also adjunct associate professor of economics and finance at the Columbia Business School, Columbia University. Prior to that, he was assistant professor of economics at the Leonard N. Stern School of Business, New York University. He also taught at the University of Chicago and at Northwestern University. Charlie has previously served as a research consultant to The World Bank and the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago.

Charlie is a Lawrence, Kansas, native, whose father had a distinguished teaching career in mathematics at KU. His list of grants, awards, publications, scholarly papers, and seminar presentations literally fill volumes, and he has earned an international reputation that is well deserved. Charlie even testified before a Special Committee of the United States Senate on Y2K technology issues. His areas of interest and expertise are corporate finance, corporate investment, macroeconomics, and panel data econometrics.

Mark Gilman '54 “Sticks” to Print Business

You know all those American flags and patriotic ribbons you see plastered on the bumpers of cars and trucks? Here's the Kansas DU to blame—**Mark S. Gilman '54**, president of Gill Studios Inc., a promotional products company in suburban Kansas City, Kansas, that sells more than \$50 million a year in decals, bumper stickers, and posters.

'Found' Music Brings a Bit of DU History to Life

Many alumni may remember the late Kansas DU Chapter Counselor **M**illoyd H. Houston, *Williams College 1904*. Lloyd's father-in-law, John H. Bell, came to Lawrence in 1884 and opened a music store in the 700 block of Massachusetts. Lloyd later took over the operation of the store, which closed in the 1970s after moving to a couple of different locations.

Robert E. Foster, conductor of the Lawrence City Band and director of bands at Kansas University, discovered a box full of music in the 1970s, but had never found a good opportunity to use it. The music was composed

by Bell well over 100 years ago, much of it never played. His marches included such snappy titles as, "Old Nippers Hick Nut Dance" and "Ragged Rapscallions."

The idea to perform one of Bell's marches came from Foster, who thought it would be appropriate to dust off the old tunes and have them performed live at an outdoor concert to help celebrate Lawrence's 151st birthday. The Lawrence City Band, under the direction of Foster, did just that under the South Park Gazebo in a late-summer birthday celebration on September 18, 2005.
